

Who Is Botis? The Serpent Who Speaks in Mirrors and Judges from Silence

A judge who does not need to raise his voice, for the weight of his gaze silences the room.

He does not lead with wrath. He leads with *vision*. Botis speaks past the noise and drills into the marrow of a matter. His truths may not be kind, but they are always clean. Where other spirits inflame desire or amplify force, Botis stills the waters—only to show what's buried beneath.

A Spirit of Strategic Clarity

Botis exists in a rare current within the infernal world: the current of **revelation without collapse**. He reveals secrets, but not to destroy—only to prepare. He is invoked in moments where betrayal is suspected, when political, legal, or emotional circumstances are fraught with danger, or when a spiritual seeker is ready to shed the last remnants of personal illusion.

He does not guide by hand. He points with his gaze. Those who follow will change—first in how they speak, then in how they see, and finally in how they choose. Botis is not a teacher in the traditional sense. He is a revealer. Once the lie is exposed, your path becomes inevitable.

His Place in the Infernal Order

In the greater demonic hierarchy, Botis occupies a position of refined influence. He is not among the loud kings of ambition or the towering forces of lust and fire. His dominion is one of **serpent law**—justice without sentiment, clarity without ornament.

He is invoked by:

- Lawyers, strategists, and diplomats seeking the truth behind negotiation
- Spiritualists facing dreams of betrayal or voices they cannot place
- Therapists, mediators, or investigators unraveling buried truths
- Occultists seeking to strengthen their discernment, perception, and speech

- Those in need of protection from enemies disguised as friends

In rituals, his presence is felt through sharp internal insight, changes in how others speak to you, and shifts in dreams, mirrors, or voice.

The Archetype of the Serpent Judge

Botis is the embodiment of the **Serpent Judge**. His dual heads symbolize two poles of spiritual discernment: one that perceives and one that pronounces. The bestial head senses danger, hidden motives, and subtle shifts in intention. The human head delivers verdicts, words, and commands that neutralize or expose.

Unlike spirits of justice who punish, Botis exposes. He reveals what is, and trusts you to act. His venom is linguistic—he empowers the tongue to become a weapon of protection or revelation.

As an archetype, the Serpent Judge teaches:

- How to remain calm amid manipulation
- How to feel the current of a lie before it is spoken
- How to speak with exactness and emotional neutrality
- How to protect your sovereignty in conversations, business, and ritual

This is not the power of domination. It is the power of refined perception and calibrated expression.

When He Appears

Botis does not overwhelm the senses. His arrival is subtle but unmistakable. In ritual and invocation, he may manifest through:

- A sharp awareness of someone's deception
- Visions of mirrors, split tongues, or double faces
- Changes in your speaking pattern—fewer words, more weight
- A need to rewrite a truth you've long believed
- Dreams where you speak to yourself from another form

He often comes unannounced, particularly during situations involving betrayal, confusion, or unvoiced tension. When Botis is near, the room feels still. The air becomes heavy with potential confession.

Energy Signature

Botis' current is not aggressive—it is surgical. It moves through the throat, the mind, and the psychic skin. His presence can feel like:

The Contract of Clarity

To walk with Botis is to agree to three things:

3. **To walk alone when needed, rather than walk in delusion**

Botis does not require devotion. He requires presence. He does not wish for praise. He wants silence, and from that silence, action. You are not here to gain another spiritual badge. You are here to be changed—into one who sees, speaks, and acts without confusion.

- Snakes or serpent iconography
