

Who is Astaroth?

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There are names that tremble with taboo, names that linger like ancient embers in forgotten temples. **Astaroth** is such a name. To some, he is a Duke of Hell. To others, a fallen angel or a masked god. But to those who walk the initiatory path, Astaroth is not mythology—he is memory. A living current of knowledge wrapped in flame and shadow, wisdom and longing.

He is often depicted seated on a dragon or serpent, a crown upon his head, a book in one hand and a serpent in the other. These are not symbolic flourishes—they are instructions. He is the **master of reason and intuition, of sacred language and mystery, of revealed thought and veiled desire**.

□ The Grand Duke of the Infernal Court

In the Goetia, Astaroth is described as a **mighty Duke who commands forty**

legions. He knows all things past, present, and to come. He reveals secrets, reconciles disputes, and gives dignified presence in all things intellectual.

“He is a demon of diplomacy,” say the old grimoires.

“He speaks true, but speaks only to those who seek truth without trembling.”

Astaroth is not seduction. He is **revelation**.

This makes him a powerful ally in:

- Psychic development and dreamwork
- Healing from emotional manipulation or deception

□ **Astaroth in the Body and Psyche**

When Astaroth's current begins to move within you, certain experiences are common:

Let what is real be revealed.”

Then sit in silence. You may feel a gentle shift in temperature, a stillness in the chest, or a subtle awareness forming behind your eyes.

This is enough.

You do not summon him. You *meet* him.
