He is described as appearing initially with the face of a **leopard** and the wings of a **griffon**, evoking wild sensuality and bestial elegance. Upon command, he assumes a **beautiful human form**—a transformation symbolizing the evolution from raw primal instinct to cultivated aesthetic and charm.

This dual appearance encodes a critical magical truth: Sitri is the bridge between the animalistic heat of unfiltered lust and the refined, emotionally intelligent expression of desire. He teaches the magician how to wield both ends of that

spectrum with grace and power.

5. Extended Symbolism of Sitri: Animal, Planetary and Elemental Keys

To more deeply understand and anchor Sitri's current, practitioners often work with a symbolic map that reflects his energetic imprint across different esoteric languages. These correspondences are essential for rituals, talismans, and meditative visualization.

Animals

- **Leopard:** Wild sensuality, ambush, confidence, feminine ferocity
- **Griffon:** Guardian of treasure, hybrid power, royal vigilance
- **Swan** (lesser-known): Grace, erotic elegance, union of opposites

Colors

- **Copper:** Venusian charm and sensual conductivity
- **Rose red:** Passion, erotic charge, physical beauty
- **Black:** Mystery, depth, sexual shadow

Planetary Associations

- **Venus:** As the planet of love, charm, and aesthetics, Venus governs Sitri's magnetic field. However, this is not the passive Venus of sentimentality—it is **raw, untamed, and sovereign**.
- **Mars** (in shadow): For when Sitri expresses dominance, pursuit, and sexual assertion. This is best invoked carefully and consciously.

Element

- **Fire** (primary): The blaze of lust, charisma, transformation, and spiritual combustion.
 - **Air** (secondary): For communication, flirtation, and the activation of charm through speech and gesture.
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6. Spiritual Symbolism and Archetypal Role

Sitri is more than a Goetic name. He is an **archetype**—a spiritual pattern embedded in the collective unconscious, accessible to those willing to dance with the flame of their own longing.

In Jungian terms, Sitri embodies the **anima/animus in its erotic aspect**—the magnetic internal opposite that beckons us toward union.
