

The Gifts of the Triple Path: Powers of Hermes Trismegistus

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□ The Power That Moves Between Worlds

Hermes Trismegistus, the thrice-great master, is not only an initiator or archetype—he is a treasury of power. His gifts are not bestowed from on high, but *awakened* within. To walk the Hermetic path is to stir the dormant faculties of the soul and activate your divine inheritance.
