

Archetype - The Serpent Voice

To attune to Bune is to engage one of the most refined and paradoxical archetypes: *The Serpent Voice*. She is not a god of chaos, nor a brute force of power. - **Energy Shielding** – Using vocal cadence to protect aura and intention

When aligned with Bune, even your silence becomes a spell. Even a single word, when chosen with awareness, shifts outcomes.

She Who Speaks With Graves

Bune's archetype is not merely serpentine—it is *necrolinguistic*. She speaks with and for the dead. She translates the speech of tombs into currency, inheritance, and understanding. This is the hidden function of her power: reconciling what is unspoken across time.

When you enter her spiral:

- Forgotten ancestors whisper through dreams
- Buried talents emerge as new speech patterns
- Ancestral trauma reveals its signature in the throat or breath
- Unconscious debts (karmic, emotional, financial) begin to resolve through voice-led rituals

The Serpent Voice speaks both forward and backward in time. It heals by naming. It transforms by reclaiming.

The Spiral: Her Sacred Geometry

Bune does not move in straight lines. Her force spirals. This is the sacred motion of:

- DNA
- Galaxies
- Spells
- Wealth cycles
- Ancestral memory
- Energy rising through the chakras

When you speak under her current, your words do not travel directly—they *spiral outward*, touching layers you cannot consciously aim for. This is why speech aligned with Bune lands with impact even when brief. Her current moves through *depth*, not length.

To embrace this archetype is to speak with spiral logic, to chant in echo, and to carry messages from the deep—not as prophet, but as *conduit*.

The Mirror of Listening

A forgotten aspect of Bune’s archetype is *receptivity*. True speech is impossible without profound listening. The Serpent Voice does not dominate—it *reflects*. Like a mirror placed in shadow, Bune’s archetype teaches that every word we say is preceded by the words we’ve absorbed.

Through her:

- You become a listener of meaning beneath noise

The Three Levels of the Serpent Voice

This is what you spiral into during the 21-day rite—not just temporary power, but *archetypal embodiment*.

The Living Glyph

In ritual work, we often trace sigils. But when working with Bune, *you become the sigil*. Your voice, body, and spirit form her living glyph in the world.

This means:

- Your walk becomes hypnotic
- Your presence calibrates the energy of rooms
- Your breath patterns carry encoded intention
- You draw attention not with effort, but with *design*

When the Serpent Voice is fully activated, you no longer seek permission. You *move as if chosen*—because you are. By her. By fate. By silence reborn into sound.

Reflections Before the Next Descent

Before crafting Bune’s altar or speaking her mantra, feel into this archetype. Journal your relationship with your own voice:

- What is your relationship with silence?

“Where have I buried my truth—and what ancestral voice waits to rise?”

These are the coils Bune invites you to explore.

She is not a teacher of volume. She is the duchess of *vocal value*. When you master her archetype, your voice becomes not just a tool—but a *currency*, a *key*, and a *crown*.
