The Echo and the Lamp: Two Faces of a Hidden Ally

In spiritual language, archetypes are not fixed—Vassago presents two major energetic modalities depending on the soul's state:

These micro-events are how his archetype shapes your awareness. They show you what you are *already tethered to* but haven't yet noticed. The archetype of Vassago doesn't create psychic skill—it reveals its availability and *asks you to take it*.

His power is often misunderstood by those who expect flashing visions or dominant possession. Vassago is *not here to impress*. He is here to assist clarity—and clarity is rarely theatrical. Ritual Implications of the Archetype
