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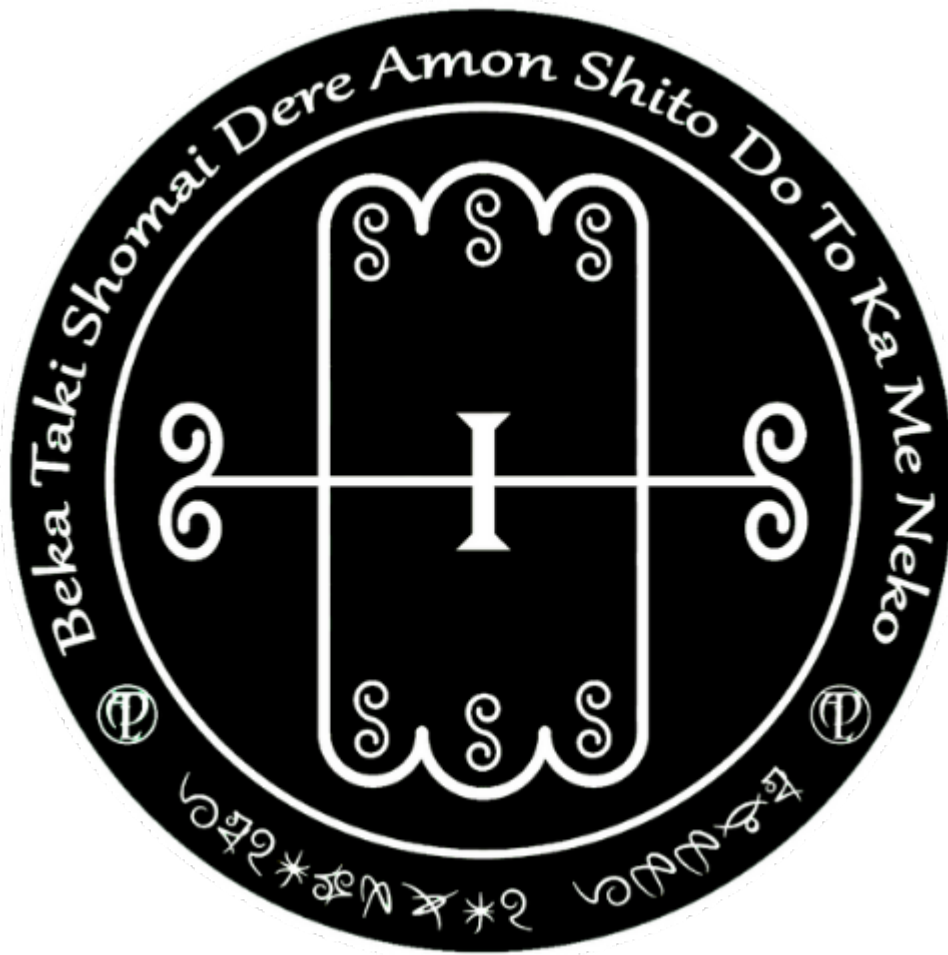


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Amon: Marquis of Divine Reconciling and Infernal Secrets in the Ars Goetia

Identity and Rank in the Ars Goetia

Amon is the seventh spirit named in the *Ars Goetia*, the first book of the *Lemegeton Clavicula Salomonis*, more commonly known as *The Lesser Key of Solomon*. He is assigned the noble title of Marquis and is said to command forty legions of spirits. His position is one of both power and paradox, as his primary functions involve uncovering hidden truths and reconciling discord between individuals. These seemingly opposed roles—of revealing and uniting—place Amon within a distinct class of Goetic spirits who serve as agents of clarity through conflict.

The name Amon is derived from ancient and complex origins. Though the Goetia does not link him directly to the Egyptian god Amun, the resonance between the

names is noteworthy, especially considering Amun's association with hiddenness and divinity. Amon in the Goetia functions as a demon who can unearth secrets and soothe division, suggesting a powerful alignment with the forces of revelation, discernment, and interpersonal harmonization.

He appears in every major manuscript tradition of the Goetia, including Sloane 3825, Sloane 2731, and Harley MS 6483. His role and attributes remain consistent across sources, affirming his status as a spirit of high trust among early ceremonialists.

Original Description from the Ars Goetia

The classical grimoires describe Amon in the following words:

“The Seventh Spirit is Amon. He is a Marquis great in power, and most stern. He appeareth like a Wolf with a Serpent's tail. Out of his mouth vomiteth flames of fire; but at the command of the Magician he putteth on the shape of a Man with Dog's teeth beset in a head like a Raven; or else like a Man with a Raven's head. He telleth all things Past and to Come. He procureth feuds and reconcileth controversies between friends.”

This original entry presents Amon as a dualistic figure—visually and functionally—capable of both creating conflict and restoring unity, all while possessing the extraordinary power to reveal events past and future.

Modern Translation and Interpretation

Amon is a formidable Marquis who initially appears in the shape of a monstrous chimera: a wolf with a serpent's tail, breathing fire. At the magician's request, he takes on a humanoid form—either a man with raven-like features or a raven-headed man with sharp canine teeth. These animalistic aspects serve to emphasize his dominion over untamed forces, both psychic and interpersonal.

His powers are twofold: he is a revealer of time and a manipulator of human relationships. He tells of things past and to come—functions traditionally aligned with prophets, oracles, and seers.
